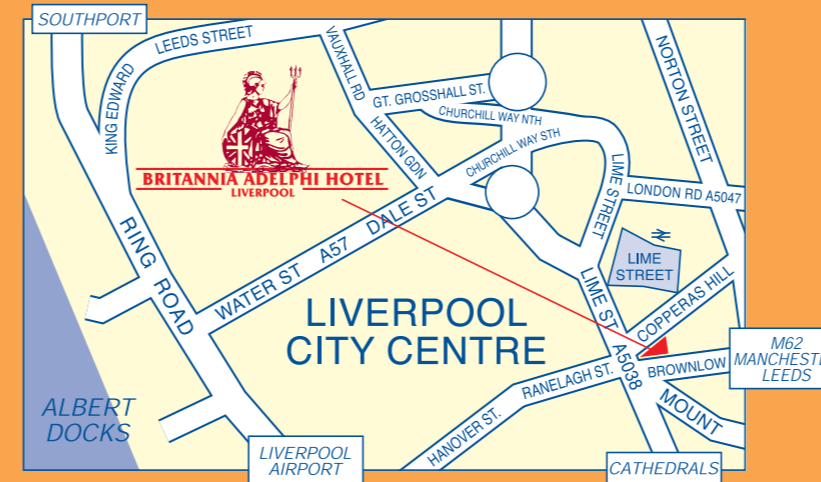

LOCATION AND TRAVEL:



ARRIVING BY RAIL:

Leave Lime Street Station via the exit near platforms 7-9. Proceed down Bolton Street, the Adelphi Hotel is only 500 yards and can be found at the bottom of Bolton Street at the Junction with Copperas Hill. Approximately a 5 minute walk.

ARRIVING AT JOHN LENNON AIRPORT:

The Adelphi Hotel is just over 30 minutes from the airport by frequent bus services 86A & 500 or 20 minutes by taxi.

DRIVING FROM THE MOTORWAY:

Take the M62 to the end, and follow signs for Liverpool City Centre. Then follow signs for Lime Street Train Station. The Adelphi Hotel is located on the left, just past the Train Station. The Car Park is charged at £5 per night, or £10 for 24 hours. An alternative NCP car park is just across the road from the right hand side of the hotel in Brownlow Hill.

TRAVELLING BY BUS:

Frequent buses operate from all of Merseyside and surrounding areas to Liverpool City Centre; many stop directly outside the hotel. National Express and Stagecoach operate express coach services from many parts of the country to Liverpool. Visit www.traveline.info or call 0871 200 2233.
